1. Implications for Local Governments - South East Queensland

2. Urban Infrastructure and Climate Change Adaptation

The study examines the role of government regarding climate change adaptation. It identifies potential climate change impacts to city (Fredericton, New Brunswick) infrastructure namely; waterways and greenways, storm water, utilities, roadways, sanitary sewer, solid waste disposal, and emergency preparedness systems. The study provides recommendations for implementation of effective climate change adaptation techniques.

3. Climate Change, Peace and War - Linkage

The report examines how the consequences of climate change can lead to violent conflict, and shows how this will hinder the effort to adapt to climate change. It indicates that peace-building and adaptation to climate change can complement each other in laying the basis for long-term social and economic development. The report identifies policies and mechanisms that will help communities understand the challenges of climate change and respond in such a way that they avoid violent conflict.

4. Rainfall Variability Impacts on Crop Yield - Nigeria

The study uses GIS technique to examine and map the spatio-temporal impact of rainwater variability for crop maize yields in the Guinea Savanna Ecological Zone of Nigeria. The results of the analysis produced show that inter-annual rainfall variability brings about the differences in the rate of maize yield in Nigeria.
