This first climate change adaptation plan for Victoria (Australia) focuses on government preparedness by ensuring that: appropriate risk management strategies are in place for public assets and services; enhanced disaster resilience strategies are being implemented; and government policies and programs encourage and facilitate climate resilience and adaptive capacity across the Victorian community.

Climate Adaptation Strategies in Coastal Areas

This report is an account of a cross-country study that covers Vietnam, Indonesia and the Philippines. It documents the impacts of three climate hazards affecting coastal communities; namely typhoon/flooding, coastal erosion and saltwater intrusion. The report analyzes adaptation options, which communities and local governments can implement to protect and insure themselves from these hazards.

Hurricane Sandy Rebuilding Strategy

This report (released by the Hurricane Sandy Task Force) focuses on criteria for the investment of U.S. federal funds in rebuilding efforts. It emphasizes the following points: promoting resilient buildings based on current and future risks; ensuring a regionally coordinated and resilient approach to infrastructure investment; providing families safe, affordable housing options; and building local government's capacity to plan for long-term rebuilding efforts.

The tools include: knowledge navigator (a categorized dataset of climate change platforms covering adaptation, mitigation and development); CDKN rosters of experts; and Reegle API (an automated tagging and search tool).
