Australia's Relationship with a Climate-changed Pacific

The paper examines Australia's attitudes to climate change in the region under the two most recent federal governments: the Howard Government and the Rudd Government. It suggests that the Rudd Government should enact deep emissions cuts, provide adequate adaptation assistance, and look to the possibility of providing refuge for those displaced by climate change.

Environmental Change and Energy Infrastructure

The paper identifies some of the most vulnerable nodes in the global energy infrastructure and shows how they might be affected by moderate environmental change. It argues that reinforcement of global energy infrastructure is unlikely to happen overnight. The paper suggests some options in order to cope with the increasing variability caused by environmental change.

Climate Change Impacts and Adaptation Options - Mediterranean

The report presents an overview of the expected impacts of climate change in the Mediterranean over the next century. It provides a general framework for implementation of adaptation in the region. The report puts forward some recommendations (in the form of key principles) to guide design and implementation of various adaptation strategies.

Vulnerability Interventions in the Context of Multiple Stressors

The paper presents lessons learned from an ongoing initiative (Southern Africa Vulnerability Initiative) to develop a framework for assessing vulnerability in the context of multiple stressors. It examines three projects that address vulnerability from different contexts: rural conditions in Zambia and South Africa; informal trade in Durban; and a parastatal conservation agency in KwaZulu-Natal province, South Africa.

Children and Young People in Disaster Risk Reduction

The report stresses that the voices of children should be heard in future assessments of the Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA) – the ten-year framework for building the resilience of communities to disasters. It focuses on HFA's five key priorities: governance; risk assessment, monitoring and warning; knowledge and education; underlying risk factors; and disaster preparedness and response.
