1. Municipal Association of Victoria Climate Change Summit Discussion Paper Submission

3. India Releases First National Plan on Climate Change

India's first National Action Plan on Climate Change (NAPCC) outlines existing and future policies and programs addressing climate mitigation and adaptation. It identifies eight core 'national missions' running through 2017. The plan identifies measures that promote India's development objectives while yielding co-benefits for addressing climate change.

4. Adaptation and Development - A Continuum of Approaches

The report clarifies the relationship between adaptation and development by analyzing 135 projects, policies, and other initiatives from the developing world. A rating of activities from 'pure' development to 'pure' climate change is proposed as a conceptual framework to understand when different 'development' activities may play an 'adaptation' function.
