7. <u>German lawmakers approve troop increase for Afghanistan</u>, Deutsche Welle, 2010-02-26

The lower house of the German parliament, the Bundestag, voted to approve a plan to raise the number of Bundeswehr soldiers in Afghanistan. Chancellor Angela Merkel's cabinet had approved the plan two weeks ago, in which an additional 850 troops would be sent to Afghanistan, boosting the number of soldiers on the ground to around 5,350.
