Australian foreign aid agency AusAid had been using its financial resources to favour Fiji judges who were perceived to be opponents of the Fiji government, said Attorney-General Aiyaz Sayed-Kaiyum.

One of the uncertainties surrounding Australia's proposed purchase of the Joint Strike Fighter is its cost. The proposed purchase has increased in real cost by at least 30% since the 2002 decision to join the program was made. There seems to be enough money in the project budget to buy 100 aircraft, especially if some of them can be purchased a bit later.

The United Nations in East Timor is on the defensive after hiring disgraced former defence minister, Roque Rodrigues, as a presidential security adviser. In the wake of East Timor's civil unrest in 2006 a UN commission of inquiry report recommended that that Mr Rodrigues be prosecuted on charges of illegal weapons distribution.

6. <u>Spread of Nuclear Capability Is Feared</u>, Joby Warrick, Washington Post, 2008-05-12

Since 2004, uranium-producing countries such as Canada and Australia have sought to develop their own enrichment and reprocessing capabilities to cash in on the future growth in nuclear power generation. While no one forecasts a nuclear-armed Canada or Australia, the change could lead to more nuclear materials being transported around the world, among countries in nearly every region with heightened nuclear expertise.
