Newly declassified Australian Defence Department and Prime Minister's office files show that the US was strongly pushing for tests on Australian soil of two of the most deadly chemical weapons ever developed, VX and GB nerve gas. The plan called for 200 mainly Australian combat troops to be aerially bombed and sprayed with the chemical weapons — with all but a handful of the soldiers to be kept in the dark about the "full details" of the tests.
