 - 1. Govt Boosts Iraq Troops, AAP, Australian, 2006-09-04The Federal Government has increased the size of its troop commitment to southern Iraq and placed more armoured vehicles under its command. An additional 38 Australian Defence force personnel will be deployed to Tallil to support the operational battle group. Four armoured Bushmasters will also be deployed bringing to 19 the Bushmasters that will be provided to the operational battle group.

- 3. <u>Hundreds Killed in Afghanistan Battle</u>, AFP, Australian, 2006-09-04Four Canadian soldiers were killed today in a major anti-Taliban operation in southern Afghanistan, the defence ministry said, as NATO said the rebel death toll over two days was around 200. British forces were meanwhile preparing to repatriate the remains of 14 soldiers killed when their plane crashed yesterday, the first day of Operation Medusa which involves about 2,000 Afghan and NATO military personnel.
