Timor-Leste's then interior and defence ministers and defence force chief acted illegally in

transferring weapons to civilians during the violence that shook the small South-East Asian country early this year and should be prosecuted, according to a UN report. Also, Former Prime Minister Alkatiri failed to use his firm authority to denounce the transfer of security sector weapons to civilians.
