 Australian troops could pull out of Iraq within 12 to 18 months, the commander of Australian forces in the Middle East said. Brigadier Moon's statement came hours after an assessment by US general George Casey that the Iraqi army and police force would be capable of taking over their own security within 12 to 18 months.
