- 5. <u>Australian Secret Intelligence Service (ASIS)</u>, <u>Portfolio Budget Statement 2007-2008</u>, DFAT [PDF]The total appropriation for the Australian Secret Intelligence Service in the 2007-08 Budget is \$162.5 million, up from \$131.4 million in 2006-07. In 2001-02 the ASIS appropriation was \$54.3 million.

11. Foreign Aid up \$3.2 Billion, Brisbane Times, 2007-05-08The federal government is lifting its foreign aid budget to almost \$3.2 billion with a series of new programs. Indonesia remains Australia's largest foreign aid recipient (\$458.8 million this budget), followed by PNG (\$355.9 million) the Solomon Islands (\$223.9 million). The government plans to lift foreign aid to around \$4 billion.
