## Introduction

Location: Camp Taji is located 30 kms north of Baghdad, at 33° 31′ 46″ N, 44° 16′ 39″ E (33.529444, 44.2775) in the rural district of Taji .(التاجي) Originally a Republican Guard base, it is now a joint base for both Iraqi and foreign, principally United States, forces, as well as private security contractors.

In February 2015, New Zealand prime minister John Key <u>announced</u> that New Zealand training forces would be deployed to Camp Taji.

In March 2015, Australia announced the despatch of <u>a further 300 ground troops</u> to train Iraqi forces at Taji.
