Japan's ruling LDP is facing increasing difficulties in its push to pass security reforms following remarks made by a group of its members calling for disciplining media outlets unsupportive of the bills. As public opposition to the bills continues to grow and with top legal scholars viewing the proposed reforms as unconstitutional, the potential for talks on counterproposals offered may become more likely.
