Most China-related portions of the 1991 CINCPAC history remain classified, but U.S.-China relations appeared to continue at their low level from the late-1980s. CINCPAC's Pacific Command Strategic included the following objectives for Northeast Asia with specific relevance for China:

- Maintain open channels with China to allow for renewal of a military relationship as political climate allowed; and
- Maintain the current level of unofficial contact with Taiwan.

China did not conduct full-scale nuclear test explosions in 1991.

All tables relating to the details of Chinese nuclear force developments were withheld in error by the CINCPAC FOIA office. A new request for those pages is currently under review and will be made available when released.
