Dear Mr. Hayes:

This is a final response to your letter of November 7, 1984, which appealed the denial by Major General Walter C. Schrupp, Deputy Chief of Staff, United States Pacific Command, of quarterly reports to the Secretary of Defense. Appellate responses for some of the quarterly reports were provided previously (our sixth appellate response of November 27, 1985, refers). Under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Reform Act of 1986, as promulgated by DoD 5400.7-R at 32 CFR 286, Vol. 52, No. 132, July 10, 1987, your request on behalf of Pacific Action Research is categorized as "Other."


The withheld material from the enclosed quarterly reports to the Secretary of Defense concerns military plans, weapons or operations; the vulnerabilities or capabilities of systems, installations, projects, or plans relating to national security; foreign government information; intelligence activities, or intelligence sources or methods; and foreign relations or foreign activities of the United States (see Executive Order 12356, Section 1.3.(a)(1)(2)(3)(4) and (5)). Internal advice, recommendations and subjective evaluations pertaining to the decision-making process within the Department of Defense are also contained within the above mentioned classified categories. Unauthorized disclosure of the denied material reasonably could be expected to cause serious damage to the national security, as well as chilling the process by which defense officials may freely express their opinions, recommendations and subjective evaluations.

As appellate authority I, therefore, affirm the denied portions of the enclosed material pursuant to Title 5 USC 552(b)(1) and (5).

You are advised that you have the right to judicial review of this decision in a United States District Court in accordance with Title 5 USC 552(a)(4)(B).

Your request for a fee waiver has also been reviewed, and in this instance I have elected to waive all fees as a matter in the public interest.

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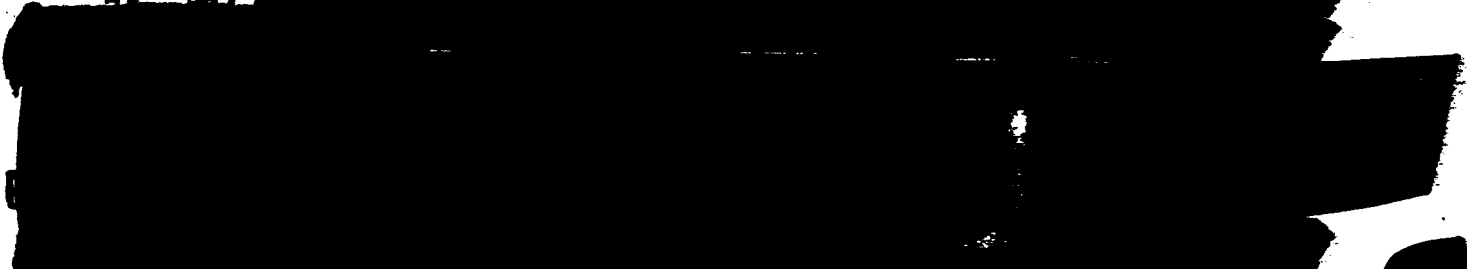

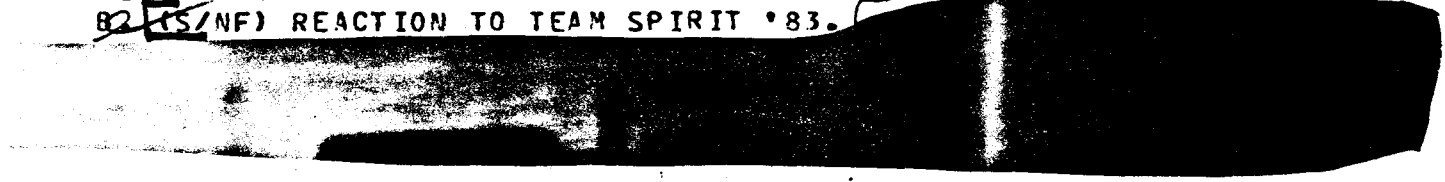
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1. (U) APPRECIATED THE OPPORTUNITY TO MEET WITH YOU AND ODF SECDEF IN MARCH. THE FOLLOWING REPRESENT PACOM'S SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES AND CONCERNS SINCE MY LAST REPORT TO YOU.

2. (U) SIGNIFICANT EVENTS IN THE PACOM.

A. (U) TEAM SPIRIT '83. THE MOST NOTABLE PACOM ACTIVITY OF THIS QUARTER WAS EXERCISE TEAM SPIRIT '83 IN KOREA. THE EXERCISE LASTED 45 DAYS AND INVOLVED OVER 190,000 ROK AND US PERSONNEL. IN ADDITION TO LARGE SCALE USA AND USAF ACTIVITIES, USN AND USMC PARTICIPATION INCLUDED DUAL CVRG OPS (ENTERPRISE AND MIDWAY) IN THE SEA OF JAPAN AS WELL AS AN AMPHIBIOUS LANDINGS BY MAJOR ELEMENTS OF USMC'S III MARINE AMPHIBIOUS FORCE. OVER 600 ROK, U. S. AIR FORCE AND MARINE AIRCRAFT PLUS AIR ASSETS FROM ENTERPRISE AND MIDWAY PARTICIPATED. THE LARGE NUMBER OF FIELD TRAINING AND LIVE FIRE EXERCISES, THE DEPLOYMENT ITSELF, AND THE JOINT/COMBINED INTEROPERABILITY "COMBAT" EXPERIENCE, SHOULD YIELD MANY DIVIDENDS IN TERMS OF INCREASED PACOM COMBAT READINESS.

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GOVERNOR'S VETO WAS CERTAINLY INFLUENCED BY HIS STRONG DEGREE TO CONTINUE OUR EXCELLENT AND LONG-STANDING CIVIL-MILITARY RELATIONSHIP AND IT UNDOUBTABLY COST HIM SOME OF HIS POLITICAL CAPITAL. THE STATE SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT HAS SINCE VISITED WASHINGTON TO EXPLAIN THE IMPACT OF CONTINUED REDUCTIONS IN FEDERAL FUNDING. I BELIEVE IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE SHOW THE POLITICAL LEADERSHIP IN HAWAII THAT WE ARE WORKING ON A FAIR SOLUTION TO THIS DIFFICULT PROBLEM AND THAT A WAY BE FOUND TO PROVIDE THE STATE WITH SOME RELIEF, AS THE LONG TERM INTEREST OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS BEST SERVED BY CONTINUING EQUITABLE IMPACT AID PAYMENTS.

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D. MICRONESIA. AS PREVIOUSLY MENTIONED, NON-APPROPRIATION OF THE MARIANAS ISLANDS LAND LEASE MONIES BY CONGRESS IN THE 82 BUDGET, AND FAILURE TO ACT PROMPTLY IN THE 83 BUDGET ON THIS IMPORTANT ISSUE, MAY HAVE SERIOUS LONG RANGE CONSEQUENCES. POSSIBLE FUTURE LOSS OF OTHER PACOM RASING AND ONGOING SOVIET INTEREST IN THE AREA MAKE IT IMPERATIVE THAT WE PRESERVE OUR OPTIONS HERE. STRONGLY RECOMMEND YOUR PERSONAL SUPPORT IN THE FY83 MILCON REQUEST.

E. (U) MEDICAL SHORTFALLS. THE LACK OF MEDICAL SUPPORT CAPABILITY FOR THEATER FORCES, ESPECIALLY DEPLOYED MARINE AMPHIBIOUS FORCES, IS A DEFINITE LIMITING FACTOR ON CONTINGENCY SUSTAINABILITY. ASD(HA), OJCS(J4), AND THE SERVICES, HAVE TAKEN VARIOUS INITIATIVES TO CORRECT THE DEFICIENCIES, WITH RELIEF PROJECTED FOR THE 84-85 TIME FRAME. I URGE CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THOSE INITIATIVES, SUCH AS ACQUISITION OF DEPLOYABLE NAVY AND AIR FORCE HOSPITALS AND A NAVY HOSPITAL SHIP.

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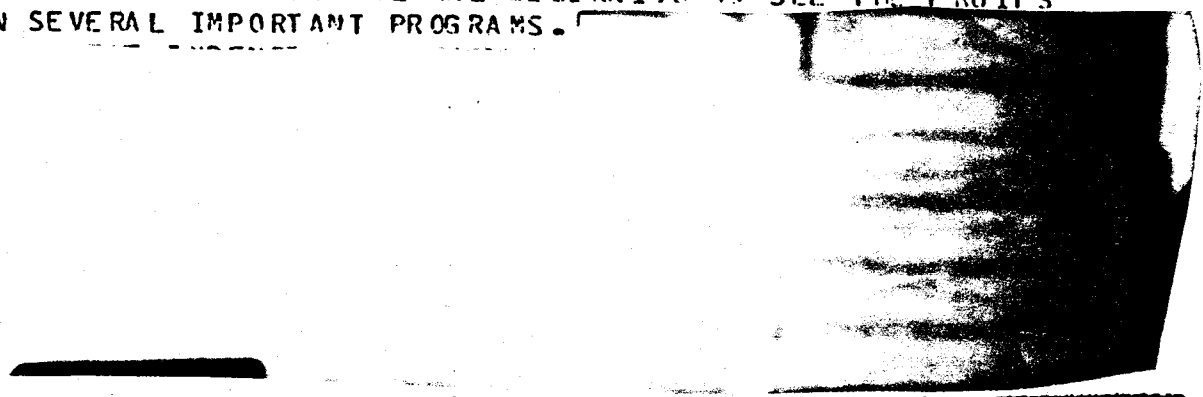

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1. INTRODUCTION: OVERALL, 1981 WAS A BUSY AND INTERESTING YEAR FOR THE PACIFIC COMMAND. THE POLICIES OF THE NEW ADMINISTRATION, PARTICULARLY THOSE PERTAINING TO DEVELOPMENT OF A GLOBAL STRATEGY AND THE RENEWED EMPHASIS ON DEFENSE IMPROVEMENTS, ARE A WELCOME STEP FORWARD. I AM ESPECIALLY PLEASSED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE REVISED PPRS SYSTEM, AND AS I NOTED TO THE DPB IN OCTOBER, THE FY 84-88 DEFENSE GUIDANCE PROMISES TO CONTINUE THE MOVEMENT TOWARD A MORE RESPONSIVE AND CREDIBLE FORCE STRUCTURE CAPABLE OF MEETING A WIDER RANGE OF POSSIBLE CONTINGENCIES, PROVIDING OUR FORCES ARE CAPABLE OF DEPLOYING WHERE AND WHEN NEEDED.

HOWEVER, AFTER YEARS OF GIVING PRIORITY CLAIM ON NEW WEAPONS, THE SOVIETS ARE NOW SENDING THEIR BEST BOMBERS, FIGHTER-BOMBERS, RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT, ARMORED PERSONNEL CARRIERS, AIRCRAFT CARRIERS, GUIDED MISSILE CRUISERS AND ASSAULT LANDING CRAFT TO THE FAR EAST.

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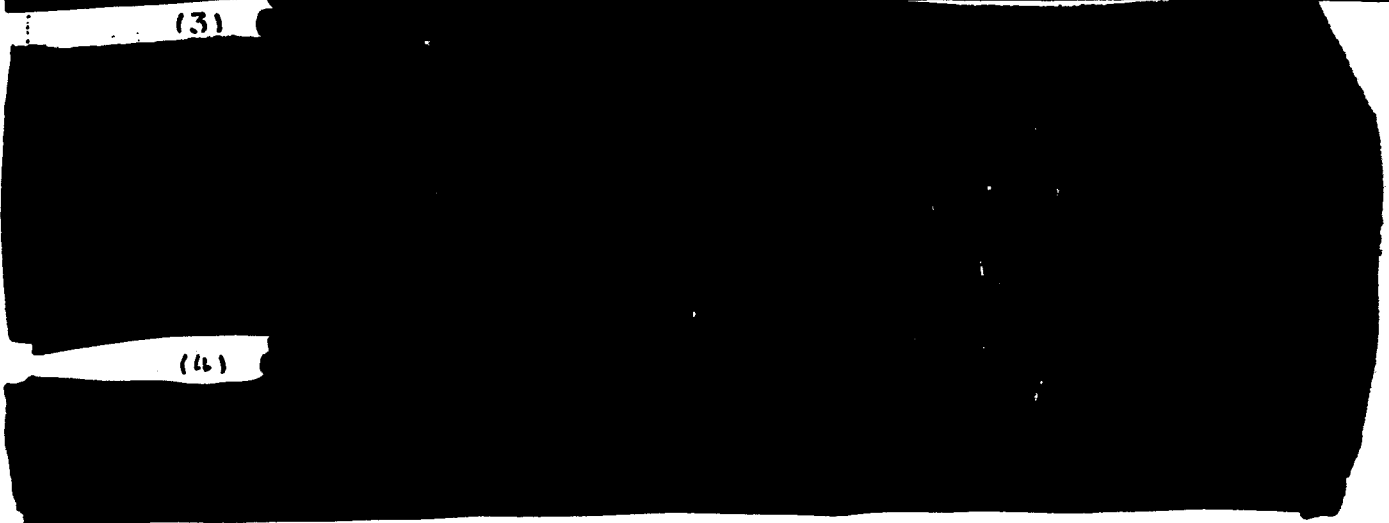

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4. OTHER ISSUES OF CONCERN:

A. PACOM EXERCISES. FREQUENT, REALISTIC EXERCISES ARE ESSENTIAL TO INSURE READINESS OF PACOM FORCES TO DEAL WITH POTENTIAL CONTINGENCIES. DUE TO THE LARGE DISTANCE INVOLVED IN MOVING FORCES IN THIS THEATER, ALLOCATION OF SUFFICIENT AIRLIFT FUNDS IS ESSENTIAL TO INSURE A VIABLE EXERCISE PROGRAM. IN THIS REGARD, AGREEMENTS REACHED AT THE 1978 SECURITY CONSULTATIVE MEETING TO ENHANCE THE LEVEL AND SCOPE OF KOREAN EXERCISES TO OFFSET WITHDRAWAL OF GROUND FORCES WERE NOT SUPPORTED BY THE ALLOCATION OF SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM. ADDITIONALLY, LACK OF FUNDS HAS CUT THE FREQUENCY OF TEMPO CAPER, THE NASCENT USA-USMC SERIES WITH THE PHILIPPINES, FROM ANNUAL TO BIENNIAL. THIS IS UNTIMELY IN THE WAKE OF HIGH-LEVEL SECURITY ASSURANCES GIVEN THE PHILIPPINES WHEN THE

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MILITARY BASE AGREEMENT AMENDMENT WAS SIGNED IN JAN 79. THIS SITUATION SERVES TO HIGHLIGHT AN INCREASINGLY APPARENT TREND WHERE DOD DECISIONS FAIL TO RECEIVE ACCEPTANCE BY OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES. IF THE US IS TO DISPLAY A CREDIBLE SENSE OF DETERMINATION TO REMAIN A PACIFIC POWER, FUNDING MUST BE PROVIDED TO SUPPORT AN ACTIVE EXERCISE PROGRAM. THE RECENT EMPHASIS TO EXPAND EXERCISE INITIATIVES WITH INDIAN OCEAN LITTORAL NATIONS TO COUNTER AN INCREASED PRESENCE BY THE USSR IN THIS VITAL AREA LENDS WEIGHT TO THE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDS.

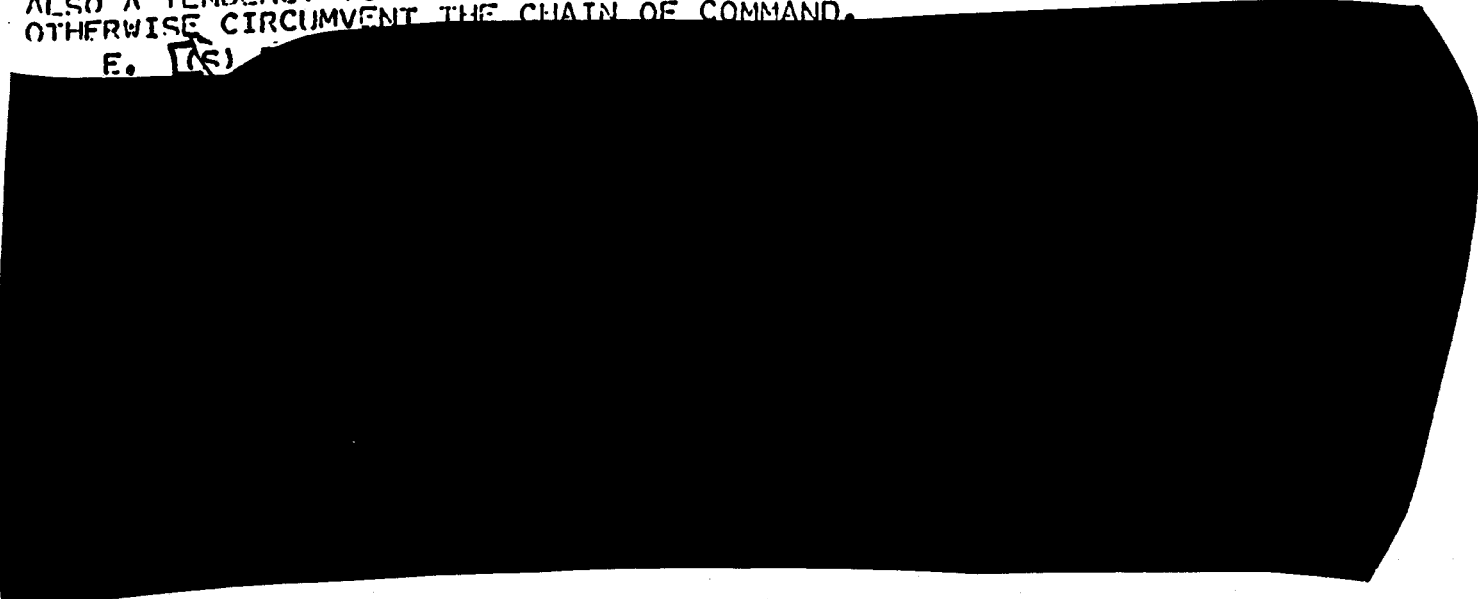
B. (U) PUBLIC INFORMATION. OVER THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS US AND FOREIGN SHIP MOVEMENTS, LOCATIONS, ACTIVITIES, AND RELATED INFORMATION HAVE BEEN ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY RELEASED AT THE DOD LEVEL. CONCURRENTLY, GUIDANCE TO MY STAFF FROM OASD (PA) NORMALLY HAS BEEN NOT TO COMMENT AND TO REFER QUERIES ON THESE SUBJECTS TO OASD (PA). I FEEL STRONGLY THAT GREATER LATITUDE AND FLEXIBILITY SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE UNIFIED COMMANDER IN THIS REGARD. THE ABILITY TO SELECTIVELY RELEASE INFORMATION OF IMPORTANCE TO THE CINCS, ALLIES AND OUR FRIENDS SHOULD BE COMMENSURATE WITH THE CINCS' RESPONSIBILITY. SUCH RELEASE OF INFORMATION CAN GO FAR TO ENHANCE THE CREDIBILITY OF PACOM IN THE EYES OF THE FOREIGN COUNTRIES IN THE REGION.

C. (U) MISROUTED ACTIONS. WITH MODERN COMMUNICATIONS, THERE IS AN INCREASED TENDENCY FOR DEFENSE OFFICIALS IN WASHINGTON TO DEAL DIRECTLY WITH UNIFIED CINCS' SUBORDINATE COMMANDS. THERE ALSO APPEARS TO BE AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS DIRECTLY TO THE FIELD FOR INFORMATION TO BE USED BY "COMMITTEES" FOR PROBLEM SOLUTION AT DEFENSE LEVEL OR INTERAGENCY MEETINGS. WHILE I RECOGNIZE THAT THE PRESS FOR EXPEDIENT ACTION SPAWNS SUCH DIRECT COMMUNICATION, ANSWERS REACH THE TOP WITHOUT THE BENEFIT AND PERSPECTIVE OF STAFFING THROUGH THE JCS AND THE UNIFIED COMMANDS AND THEIR SERVICE COMPONENTS. IN MY OPINION, USE OF THE ESTABLISHED CHAIN OF COMMAND IS ESSENTIAL TO REDUCE THE PROBABILITY THAT DECISIONS WILL BE MADE ON INCOMPLETE INFORMATION THAT HAS BYPASSED PROPER EVALUATION. I ALSO RECALL THAT TWICE IN MEETINGS WITH JOINT CHIEFS AND UNIFIED CINCS YOU HAVE STRESSED THE NECESSITY FOR USE OF THE CHAIN OF COMMAND. I BELIEVE A GENTLE REMINDER TO OSD CIVILIAN SIDE OF THE HOUSE WOULD BE HELPFUL.



ALSO A TENDENCY TO FORM "AD HOC" GROUPS WHICH INTENTIONALLY OR OTHERWISE CIRCUMVENT THE CHAIN OF COMMAND.

F. (U) TRAINING OF FOREIGN MILITARY PERSONNEL. AS INDICATED IN SEVERAL PREVIOUS QUARTERLY REPORTS, THERE IS A CONTINUING NEED TO PROVIDE TRAINING TO SELECTED FOREIGN MILITARY PERSONNEL. EQUALLY AS IMPORTANT AS THE MILITARY SKILLS LEARNED, THE TRAINING ENVIRONMENT DEVELOPS CLOSE, COOPERATIVE MILITARY-TO-MILITARY RELATIONSHIPS. I BELIEVE IT ESSENTIAL TO KEEP THESE RELATIONSHIPS VIABLE. THE SELECTION OF MIDDLE GRADE/JUNIOR OFFICERS FROM FOREIGN COUNTRIES FOR ATTENDANCE AT US SCHOOLS IS A MEANS TO THAT END. THE OPPORTUNITY FOR THEM TO ESTABLISH CONTACT AND COMMUNICATE WITH US MILITARY OFFICERS AND CIVILIANS IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF A FAVORABLE PERCEPTION OF THE UNITED STATES. TRAINING SURVEYS SHOW THAT MANY OF THESE OFFICERS RISE TO POSITIONS OF INFLUENCE AND IMPORTANCE IN THEIR ARMED FORCES AND GOVERNMENTS. FOR EXAMPLE, IN PACOM THERE ARE OVER 400 NATIONAL LEVEL MILITARY AND GOVERNMENTAL LEADERS WHO RECEIVED US SPONSORED TRAINING. I, THEREFORE, URGE THE DOD TO FULLY SUPPORT INCREASED FUNDING OF THE INTERNATIONAL MILITARY AND EDUCATION TRAINING PROGRAM AND THE GREATER USE OF COMBINED TRAINING EXERCISES AND SMALL UNIT EXCHANGES AS A MEANS TO EFFECTIVELY AND INEXPENSIVELY ENCOURAGE EMPATHETIC RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN THE US AND FRIENDLY NATIONS.

CLOSE WORKING AND PERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN US AND ALLIED OFFICERS GREATLY ENHANCES MILITARY COOPERATION AND INFLUENCES ALLIED AND FRIENDLY NATIONAL ATTITUDES TOWARD THE US. MANY OF THESE RELATIONSHIPS WHICH WERE ESTABLISHED BETWEEN MIDDLE GRADE OFFICERS DURING HW-II/KOREAN WAR HAVE STOOD US IN GOOD STEAD. THERE WAS LESS INTERACTION DURING THE VIETNAM YEARS BECAUSE OF LIMITED ALLIED PARTICIPATION THERE. I BELIEVE IT IS ESSENTIAL TO KEEP THESE RELATIONSHIPS VIABLE. WE NEED TO CROSS FERTILIZE MIDDLE GRADE/JUNIOR OFFICERS AND EXPAND OUR EFFORTS TO DEVELOP GOOD MIDDLE MANAGEMENT RELATIONSHIPS. TO THIS END I AM TAKING STEPS TO IMPROVE CONTACT IN PACOM INCLUDING EMPHASIS ON COMBINED EXERCISES AT THE SMALL UNIT LEVEL AND WILL TARGET PORTIONS OF THE IMET PROGRAM TOWARD CULTIVATING THE MIDDLE GRADE OFFICER STRUCTURE. I CALL THIS SITUATION TO YOUR ATTENTION AS I BELIEVE THIS CONDITION EXISTS WORLDWIDE, AND IN SUBSEQUENT REPORTS WILL EVALUATE OUR PROGRESS AND RECOMMEND AREAS FOR INCREASED DOD EMPHASIS.

G. CENTER FOR STRATEGIC AND INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (CSIS)

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STUDY OF PHILIPPINE BASES. DURING RECENT VISIT TO CINCPAC, DR. CARLSON, HEAD OF THE CSIS STUDY GROUP, INDICATED STUDY IS BROAD IN SCOPE AND WILL INCLUDE AN ANALYSIS OF RP-US RELATIONSHIP AS IT PERTAINS TO THE BASES, AS WELL AS EXAMINATION OF ALTERNATIVES FOR COMMERCIALIZATION/INDUSTRIALIZATION OF BASES.



HOWEVER, THERE IS RECENT INDICATION THAT THE PHILIPPINE ASSOCIATION, A BUSINESS ORGANIZATION BASED IN THE PHILIPPINES, AND ORIGINALLY ALLEGED TO HAVE CONTRACTED FOR THE STUDY, IS RELUCTANT TO FUND IT, LEAVING SOME UNCERTAINTY AS TO THE SCOPE AND FUTURE OF THE STUDY.

H. COMMUNICATIONS. LACK OF TIMELY APPROVAL/FUNDING/IMPLEMENTATION GUIDANCE FOR DEFENSE COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS (DCS) HAS CAUSED DELAY IN UPGRADING SOME COMMUNICATIONS PROJECTS IN THE PACIFIC. FOR EXAMPLE, THE KOREA IMPROVEMENT PROJECT WAS NOT INCLUDED IN THE FY80 POM CYCLE DUE TO NON-RECEIPT JF OSD GUIDANCE. REQUEST GUIDANCE BE PROVIDED RELATIVE TO DCS FIVE YEAR PROGRAM TO PERMIT TIMELY INCLUSION IN POM CYCLE.

3. I AM PLEASED TO LEARN THAT YOU WILL GREET THE F-4 DEPLOYMENT TO KOREA AND PARTICIPATE IN THE COMBINED FORCES COMMAND ACTIVATION. YOUR VISIT TO KOREA AND JAPAN, COMBINED WITH THE RECENT E-3A AIR-CRAFT DEPLOYMENT TO THE PACOM, PROVIDES CONTINUING SIGNAL OF US INTEREST IN AND COMMITMENT TO THE AREA.

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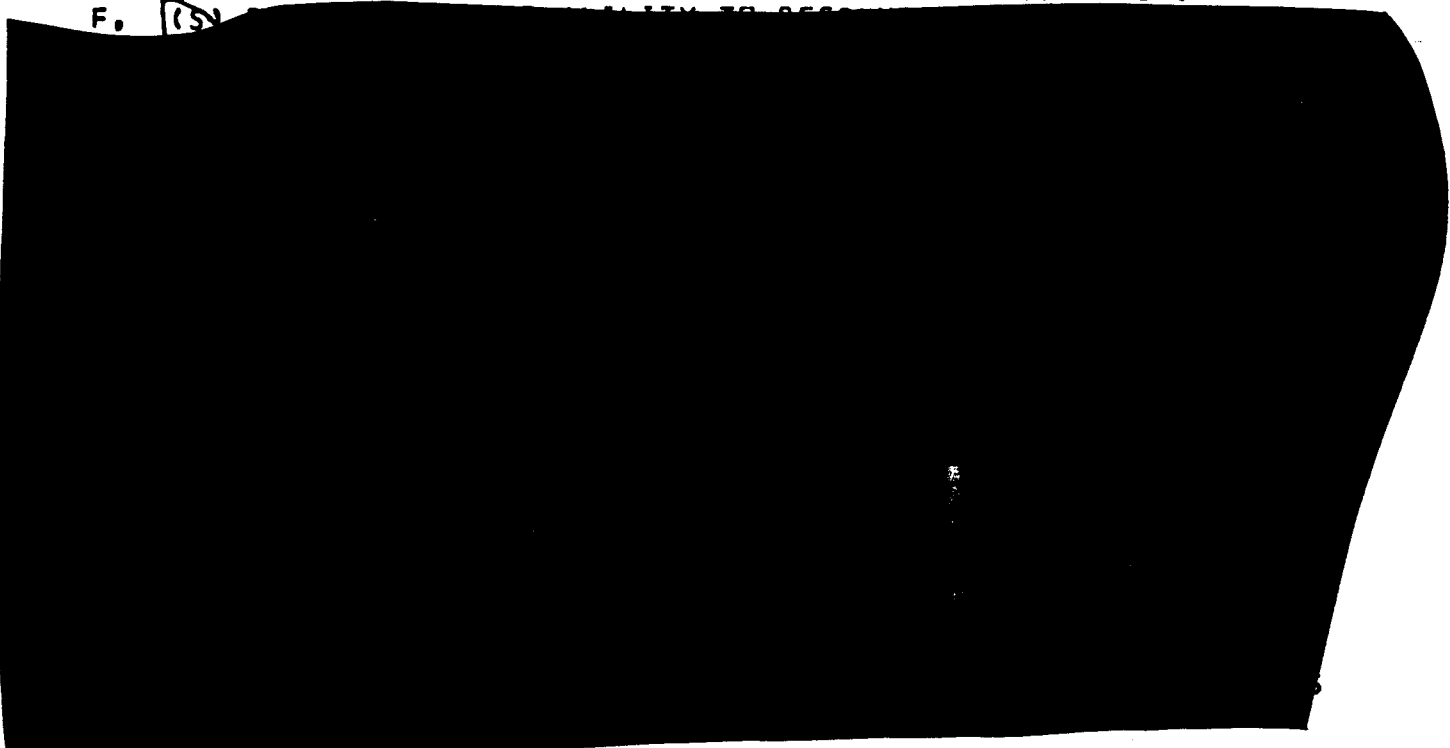

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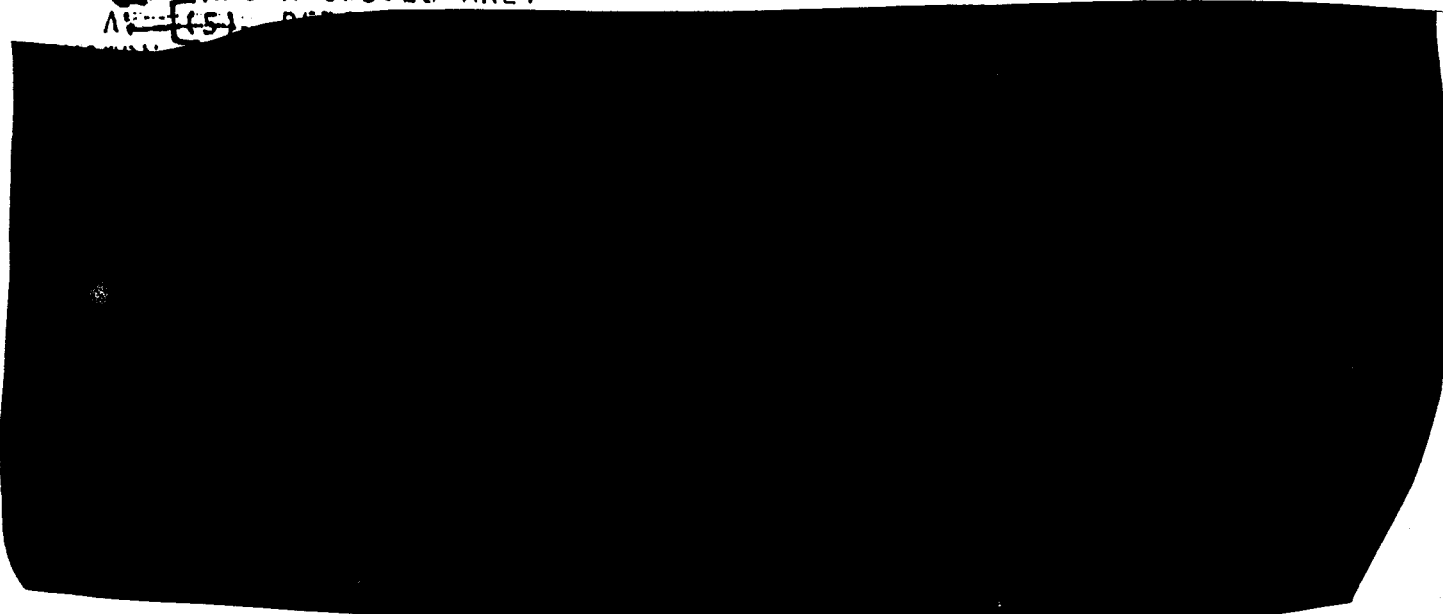

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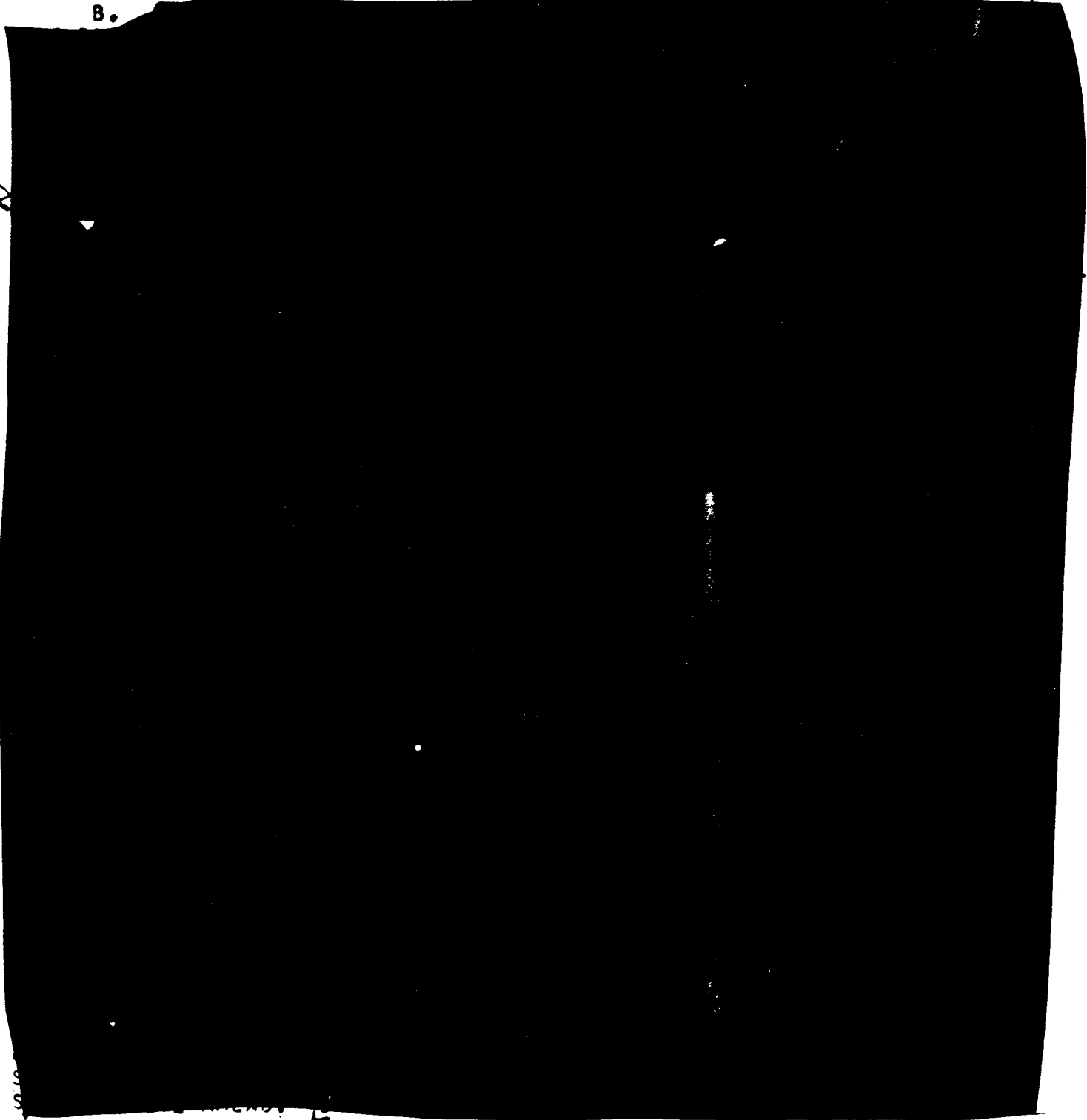
